# **PREFACE**

The relocation and internment of Japanese-Americans during World War II has been called one of the worst abuses of governmental authority in the history of the United States. Beginning in 1942 more than 120,000 Japanese-Americans, most of them living on the West Coast, were ordered to leave their homes and were transported to relocation centers (camps) for the duration of the war. The internees were stripped of both their possessions and their civil liberties.

The factors of racism, war hysteria, geographical concentration of the Japanese-Americans, and the genuine military threat from Japan had combined to set the stage for the series of decisions in 1940–42 which culminated in Executive Order 9066, authorizing the War Department to evacuate and incarcerate civilians as a "protection against espionage and against sabotage." Although no ethnic group was singled out in the executive order, the vast majority of civilians affected were those of Japanese ancestry; others included German aliens, Italian aliens, and any person suspected of being a risk to the national defense. The actual internment of civilians was administered by the War Relocation Authority (under the Department of the Interior), while the Army was responsible for transportation to the camps, and while the War Department and the FBI conducted intelligence operations (in addition to having been early advocates of a broad policy of relocation and internment).

A generation after the last camps were disbanded, Congress established in 1980 the Commission on Wartime Relocation and Internment of Civilians (CWRIC). The purpose of CWRIC was to review the facts and circumstances surrounding both the decision to issue Executive Order 9066 and the way in which the order was implemented, as well as to assess the impact of the order on the American citizens and resident aliens who were relocated and interned. During the course of its investigation, CWRIC compiled a vast quantity of documentary materials from the records of all of the relevant federal agencies (as

well as state and private sources), just a few of which are mentioned here: the War Department (diaries and telephone transcripts of high-level officials), the Army (reports and statistics), the War Relocation Authority (field reports and community analysis reports), the FBI (background memoranda and investigative reports), the Department of Justice (legal papers and investigative files), and important, previously unpublished records from regional military commands, the Department of the Treasury, the Office of Naval Intelligence, the National Security Agency, and Congress. Also included are papers of all the officials involved with the relocation and internment of civilians: President Roosevelt, General Eisenhower, Attorney General Francis Biddle, Secretary of the Navy James Forrestal, FBI Director J. Edgar Hoover, Assistant Secretary of the Interior Abe Fortas, Governor Earl Warren of California, and many others.

Collected from libraries and archives throughout the country and organized into a voluminous *Numerical File Archive* for use by CWRIC staff and attorneys, this unique and invaluble documentary record was deposited at the National Archives in 1983 after CWRIC issued its final report, *Personal Justice Denied*. In fact, the *Numerical File Archive*'s numbering system is keyed to the final report, thus giving researchers easy access to the *Numerical File Archive* and indicating how extensively the final report drew upon the documentation in the *Numerical File Archive* provides the primary documents which are essential to any study of this important chapter in American history.
