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SCOPE AND CONTENT NOTE

This edition contains case files from the NAACP Legal Department for the southern states between 1956 and 1965. Many of the cases are among the leading judicial proceedings of the civil rights era, including the defense of the NAACP's freedom to organize in the South without the interference of hostile state governments, the Jackson and Clarksdale, Mississippi, demonstration cases, and the battle to force Prince Edward County, Virginia, schools to remain open in the wake of desegregation rulings. In addition there are numerous cases involving desegregation efforts at public schools and public facilities in compliance with the constitutional ruling in *Brown v. Board of Education*. There are also cases defending voting rights in the South, defending NAACP leaders against libel actions and false arrests, and defending African Americans in criminal proceedings. University admission cases, employment discrimination, and housing discrimination cases can also be found in the collection, but these are fewer in number for the period covered. In summary, this edition provides an excellent overview of civil rights litigation in the South for the period between 1956 and 1965 with an exceptionally rich concentration in the first three areas mentioned above.

Official state attacks on the NAACP spread throughout the South after the state of Alabama effectively outlawed the association and its local branches from operating within its borders shortly after the decision in *Brown v. Board of Education*. Arkansas, Georgia, Louisiana, Mississippi, North Carolina, Texas, and Virginia each passed legislation attempting to curtail the NAACP's presence. Florida established a legislative investigating committee. Most of the laws were designed to force the association to turn over membership records. In the climate of most southern states, revelation of NAACP membership was an invitation to extralegal retaliation. The NAACP steadfastly refused to compromise the safety of its members and refused to divulge their names and addresses. In 1964, the Supreme Court of the United States ruled these state laws unconstitutional as a direct result of the litigation contained in the files. There were variations to the Alabama model of official repression, including the Florida investigating committee, local ordinances designed to harass the NAACP in Arkansas, and prosecutions of NAACP attorneys for barratry in Virginia. In Arkansas, the NAACP itself petitioned to disband the State Sovereignty Commission.

The wave of demonstrations that swept the South in the early 1960s also provoked acts of official repression, which in turn led to extensive NAACP litigation. Rights to picket and hold demonstrations were frequently denied by local police and civil authorities. Often injunctions were sought from compliant southern judges and magistrates. Picket and demonstration participants were frequently jailed, often with a large measure of police brutality. The NAACP contested denials of picket rights and assembly. It posted bail bond for jailed demonstrators and occasionally instituted *habeas corpus* proceedings.

Local branches of the NAACP took the initiative to desegregate public facilities throughout the South in compliance with the new constitutional doctrine of *Brown v. Board of Education*. The cases of *Dove v. Parham* in Arkansas and *Allen v. County School Board* and *Griffin v. County School Board* in Virginia are major. Among the many cases in this edition are those dealing with integration of public schools in Arkansas, Florida, Mississippi, Oklahoma, Tennessee, and Virginia; bathing beaches in Florida and Mississippi; metropolitan transit in Georgia and Tennessee; railroads in Mississippi; and public facilities in most of the southern states.

There are three voting rights cases. The most significant is the Alabama gerrymandering case, *Gomillion v. Lightfoot*. Two cases protesting intimidation of voters can be found in Mississippi and Tennessee files. Far more common in the files are defenses of local NAACP leaders against trumped-up criminal, libel, and defamation charges. There are two university admission cases (Alabama and Tennessee), two jury exclusion cases (Georgia and Virginia), three employment discrimination cases (Georgia and Texas), and a suit against an urban renewal project in Daytona Beach, Florida.

Leading civil rights figures of the 1950s and 1960s are involved in many of the cases, making the files a valuable source of biographical information. Roy Wilkins and Medgar Evers are leading figures in the Jackson, Mississippi, demonstration cases. Evers' murder came in the wake of the Jackson demonstration. Aaron Henry is the principal in the Clarksdale, Mississippi, demonstration cases and in several false arrest and libel cases in the Mississippi series. Chuck McDew and Robert Moses are key subjects in the McComb, Mississippi, demonstration case. C. G. Gomillion is the plaintiff in the Alabama racial gerrymandering case, *Gomillion v. Lightfoot*. Arkansas publisher and NAACP leader Daisy Bates is the plaintiff in *Bates v. City of Little Rock*. Rev. Theodore Gibson is a plaintiff in several of the Florida cases, including *Gibson v. Board of Public Instruction* and *Gibson v. Florida Legislative Committee*. The redoubtable New Orleans civil rights lawyer A. P. Tureaud is prominent in several of the Louisiana cases. A. Maceo Smith and U. Simpson Tate are prominent as local attorneys in several of the Texas cases.

The NAACP Legal Department evolved as a major force in civil rights litigation after Thurgood Marshall separated the longstanding NAACP Legal Defense and Educational Fund (LDEF) from the NAACP proper in 1957. The separation was made in order to preserve the federal “tax exempt” status that the LDEF enjoyed as a nonprofit, nonpolitical arm of the NAACP. The status was under challenge because the parent organization was clearly political in nature as a major lobby for civil rights legislation. After convincing the NAACP’s Board of Directors of the need to separate the two organizations, Marshall’s LDEF pressed ahead with litigation to force compliance with *Brown v. Board of Education* and also took up many cases to vindicate voting rights, fair housing opportunities, and to defend the constitutional rights of African Americans in criminal proceedings. Robert L. Carter succeeded Marshall as General Counsel to the NAACP and served the corporate needs of the parent organization, which included adjudicating internal NAACP disputes and defending the organization itself from hostile actions of state governments in the South. However, the lines of demarcation between Marshall’s LDEF and Carter’s NAACP Legal Department were soon blurred. This was a result, in part, of Carter’s need to represent local NAACP leaders, who in their official capacity as branch presidents or state conference leaders, became involved in civil rights litigation. Many of these local leaders became embroiled in criminal prosecutions because of their civil rights work in the South. Carter’s office, therefore, defended constitutional safeguards against false arrest and malicious prosecutions just as the LDEF did. In addition, many local NAACP branch leaders spearheaded desegregation drives by filing as petitioners in cases. This also drew Carter’s office into many of the same types of cases that Marshall was litigating on behalf of the LDEF, including school desegregation and the desegregation of public facilities. However, another salient fact is that Robert Carter strenuously disagreed with Thurgood Marshall that it was necessary (or advisable) to separate the LDEF from the NAACP. He was personally willing to have his office of General Counsel continue, in the tradition which Thurgood Marshall had begun, as a resource in all cases where there was a promise of strengthening or attaining the legal rights of African Americans.

Researchers should note that there are three companion editions of NAACP Legal Department Files for the 1956–1965 period. *Part 22: Legal Department Administrative Files, 1956–1965* contains the complete deposit of Robert L. Carter’s administrative office files for the period. This includes his general correspondence and memoranda files, subject files, and files in connection with adjudicating internal NAACP disputes. The correspondence and memoranda files touch upon many of the cases covered in the case files of the present edition. In addition, there are two companion editions of case

files organized by geographic region. These are: *Papers of the NAACP, Part 23, Legal Department Case Files, Series B: The Northeast* and *Series C, The Mid and Far West*.

Each of the case file editions is arranged geographically by alphabetical order of the states. States in the present edition are Alabama, Arkansas, Florida, Georgia, Kentucky, Louisiana, Maryland, Mississippi, North Carolina, Oklahoma, South Carolina, Tennessee, Texas, and Virginia. The border states of West Virginia, Delaware, and Missouri are filmed with the Northeast and the Mid and Far West, respectively. Larger cases are typically subdivided into file series of Background Material, General Case Material, and Withdrawn Case Material. Background Material includes correspondence and exhibits. General Case Material includes correspondence of the attorneys and the NAACP General Counsel's office during the course of the litigation. Withdrawn Case Material includes copies of legal documents such as briefs, motions, and depositions. Some transcripts can also be found in these subseries. In addition, there is a separate series for oversized materials, consisting almost entirely of transcripts for several major cases. It was necessary to film the oversize materials on separate reels at the end of the edition, beginning alphabetical by state, at Reel 57. Indications as to the existence of oversized materials are made, when appropriate, in the reel index of the user's guide.

NOTE ON SOURCES

The records microfilmed for this edition come from Group V, Series B of the NAACP Collection held by the Manuscript Division of the Library of Congress, Washington, D.C.

EDITORIAL NOTE

This edition was compiled by Professors John H. Bracey Jr. and August Meier after a complete survey of the records of the NAACP Legal Department for the period before 1965 deposited at the Library of Congress and classified as Group V of the NAACP collection. Every southern case file was selected for the edition. Each file has been microfilmed in its entirety.
