SCOPE AND CONTENT NOTE

This series of *Papers of the NAACP* consists of the General Department Files of the NAACP's Branch Department for the period from 1966 to 1970. The files primarily consist of correspondence and reports from Branch Department field staff and from Branch Director Gloster B. Current. The files are arranged alphabetically by subject or by name of correspondent.

Gloster B. Current led the NAACP's Branch Department from 1946 to 1976 and this General Department File reflects Current's strong presence in the department. The largest group of files in this edition consists of correspondence, memoranda, speeches, and reports pertaining to Current. These files begin at Frame 0163 of Reel 3 and continue through to Frame 0342 of Reel 6. The files of correspondence and memoranda from Current show that he often made important comments on NAACP policies and programs, particularly in terms of the Branch Department's central role in membership retention and recruitment. For example, in a May 31, 1966, memorandum to Branch Department staff members, Current discussed the Student Nonviolent Coordinating Committee's (SNCC) turn to "black nationalism," and he suggested that the NAACP might use SNCC's policy shift to attract new members on college campuses. In a September 1967 memorandum to Executive Director Roy Wilkins and Assistant Executive Director John A. Morsell, Current discussed the importance of expanding the NAACP's presence in urban areas. A July 3, 1968, memorandum from Current to Wilkins again focused on increasing youth memberships and also commented on the need to reactivate the NAACP's Church Department.

Current's commitment to his work with the Branch Department is further reflected in the itineraries file (Reel 4, Frame 0270) and in several files of speeches (Reel 5, Frame 0767, and Reel 6, Frames 0001 and 0046). These files show that Current traveled throughout the country to appear before NAACP branch and state conference meetings and other gatherings. The speeches also demonstrate Current's knowledge of the NAACP programs and the central issues facing the NAACP and the African American freedom movement between 1966 and 1970. Topics covered in Current's speeches include the passage of federal civil rights legislation in 1966, NAACP programs in employment and housing, school desegregation, the political backlash against civil rights gains, and the civil rights policy of the Nixon administration.

Another significant concentration of files in this edition consists of correspondence and reports from Branch Department state and regional field staff. Current required the field staff to submit detailed monthly and annual reports

summarizing NAACP initiatives and other developments in their state or region. Field staff covered in this edition include Thomas H. Allen (New York–New England area); Harvey Ronald H. Britton (Louisiana); Kenneth L. Buford (Alabama); Marvin Davies (Florida); Sydney Finley (Midwest Region); Gertrude Gorman (field director at large); Jerry M. Guess (New York–New England area); Charles E. Mays (West Coast Region); I. DeQuincey Newman (South Carolina); Phillip H. Savage (Pennsylvania, New Jersey, and Delaware); and Harold C. Strickland (Ohio). Additional field staff files for this period can be found in UPA's *Papers of the NAACP, Part 29: Branch Department, Series A: Field Staff Files, 1965–1972.* Field staff files for the period from 1940 to 1965 can be found in *Papers of the NAACP, Part 25: Branch Department Files.*

Membership and fund-raising are two major themes covered in this edition. Maintaining high membership levels was essential to the success of the NAACP—not only did it validate the association's program and approach, but it was also largely through membership dues that the association financed many of its programs and paid for its staff of field secretaries. Lucille Black was secretary for memberships, and memberships is the major topic covered in her files (Reel 1, Frames 0440–0822). Files pertaining to the association's life membership program begin at Frame 0808 of Reel 9 and continue through to Frame 0856 of Reel 10. In addition, field staff reports generally include comments about memberships and fundraising.
