SCOPE AND CONTENT NOTE

This edition contains the second half of the subject files of the NAACP Youth Department from 1940 through 1955. It begins with the letter “N” (NAACP Dance) and runs through “Y” (Youthbuilders). *Papers of the NAACP, Part 19B* contains the alphabetical subject file from “A” through “M.” The pre-1940 files of the Youth Department constitute *Papers of the NAACP, Part 19A*.

The 1943 constitution for youth councils and college chapters (which can be found in the file by the same name in *Part 19B*) outlines the objective of the NAACP’s youth movement:

Its objects shall be to inform youth of the political, economic, educational and social betterment of the colored people, to stimulate an appreciation of the history, achievements, and contributions of the Negro to civilization, to develop an intelligent, militant leadership through devising, working out and pursuing local youth work programs, and to cooperate with and support the national program of the Association and the local program of the Branch and as directed by the Board of Directors of the Association.

The subject files collectively document the NAACP’s pursuit of this vision. Efforts to build and expand the movement are the subject of regular communications among national officers and between the national office and local leaders. Suggestions of ways that the youth councils might advance the program of the NAACP against segregation and discrimination are a recurrent topic. Notices and reminders about black cultural affairs are also frequent. A scanning of the alphabetical listings in the ReelIndex will provide a sense of the wide range of subjects the Youth Department kept on file between 1940 and 1955.

The subjects in *Part 19C* fall generally into two broad categories: files pertaining to the organization of the NAACP youth movement and files pertaining to outreach with other organizations.

The larger of these categories pertains to the organization of the NAACP youth movement. The files titled Youth Newsletters (Reel 27) provide a brief, yet most comprehensive overview of the movement. The newsletters contain information on national youth programs as well as many reports from local

youth councils and college chapters. National programs noted in the newsletters include conferences, such as the Youth Legislative Conferences, which are the subject of more extensive files elsewhere in the microfilm. Growth in membership of the youth movement is regularly reported in the newsletters, as are reminders of the national legislative program of the NAACP and news of recent NAACP court victories. Each issue contains many brief items from local youth councils and college chapters reporting significant local activities and leadership changes.

Another useful core file for assessing the overall activity of the NAACP youth movement is the file on Reel 12 of Reports of the Youth Secretary to the Board of Directors. The file contains monthly reports from the national office on the policies and activities of the national Youth Department. However, this file covers only 1953 through 1955. It seems to have been separated from the larger series of Youth Director Herbert Wright's files.

Researchers should note that *Part 19B* of this edition also includes materials that provide a comprehensive overview of the youth movement, notably the files of Annual Activities Reports and Annual Reports of the Youth Movement.

This edition includes the office files of two of the four NAACP youth directors for the period between 1940 and 1955—James H. Robinson (1940 on Reel 12) and Herbert L. Wright (1951–1955 on Reels 19 through 21). The office files for Ruby Hurley (1943–1951) and Madison S. Jones (1940–1943) are reproduced in *Part 19B*. The Robinson files include correspondence, memoranda, and expense statements. They provide a detailed, day-to-day overview of the administration of the Youth Department. Wright's files for the years 1951 through 1955 are more extensive but also cover the daily routine of the Youth Department.

A further level of detail on Youth Council activities can be found in the files entitled Youth Council Organizing, 1940–1955, on Reels 23 through 26. These files are a comprehensive record of communications with local youth councils and college chapters for the entire period covered by the microfilm. The correspondence often details the initial contact by national youth directors with local leaders, efforts to establish local chapters, and follow-up support to nurture the chapters. Complementary to this series are the files on Reels 10 and 11 entitled Reports of Election of Officers of Youth Councils. These files cover only the years 1944 through 1949, and contain lists of officers of youth councils and college chapters. Some record outstanding achievements as well. Another complement to these local communications are the files entitled Officers of Youth Councils and College Chapters (Reels 8 and 9). These contain lists of the local officers from 1943 through 1955.

More specific organizational files include those of the National Planning and Advisory Committee, 1947–1949 (Reel 2). This body was established by

Ruby Hurley to cultivate a closer relationship between the national office and the local chapters. A similar committee set up by Hurley's successor, Herbert Wright, was the National Youth Work Committee, whose files run from 1951 through 1955 (on Reels 7 and 8). Both of these committees were formed at least partly in response to the demands of local youth chapters for more of a voice in the formulation of national NAACP policies.

The last organizational file series of major significance is the National Youth Legislative Conference (Reels 5–7) for 1949–1955. This became one of the youth movement's major programs in the late 1940s and 1950s. It was developed to cultivate an understanding among youth leaders of the importance of federal civil rights legislation in the battle for racial equality. While the focus was on national legislation, the conferences frequently held workshops on the possibilities of state and local legislation. The first two conferences, 1947 and 1948, are filed separately under Washington Legislative and Lobbying Conference (Reels 16 and 17).

The second general type of file to be found in the Youth Department subject file concerns relations with other organizations. Of these, the most important (and voluminous) are the files of the National Social Welfare Assembly (NSWA) and its youth affiliate, the Young Adult Council (YAC). The NSWA was a social democratic union of religious and interracial organizations. The group was significant for the links it forged between NAACP youth leaders and both Jews and white Christians. The NSWA Youth Council was involved with educational, housing, civil rights, and civil liberties issues. It also concerned itself with foreign affairs. Separate files on the World Assembly of Youth (Reels 17 and 18) document the NSWA Youth Council and NAACP involvement in foreign youth networks.

Other youth organizations covered in this edition include the National Commission on Children and Youth (Reel 1); National Students Association (Reels 2 and 3); Student League for Industrial Democracy (Reel 14); Students for Democratic Action (Reel 14); the YMCA and YWCA (Reel 22); Youth Committee for Democracy (Reels 22 and 23), a pacifist group; and the Youthbuilders (Reel 27). The Students for Democratic Action file provides some documentation on the anti-Communist thrust of the liberal youth movement. The National Students Association, headed by future congressman and civil rights activist Allard Lowenstein, worked with the NAACP to combat racial discrimination (including textbook bias) on college campuses. Youthbuilders was a New York City Board of Education program designed to promote intercultural understanding. The files for the Student League for Industrial Democracy and the Youth Committee for Democracy contain largely incoming materials, making it difficult to judge how closely the NAACP youth movement worked with these organizations.

Researchers should also consult the finding aid for *Papers of the NAACP, Part 19B*, which reproduces the first half of the Youth Department Subject file,

where files on several other organizations, such as the American Jewish Congress, the International Union of Students, and the Midcentury White House Conference on Children and Youth may be found.

NOTE ON SOURCES

Records for this microfilm are drawn from the NAACP Collection at the Library of Congress, Washington, D.C. The Youth File of the NAACP is Series E of the original collection. Parts 19A and 19B of University Publications of America's edition of *Papers of the NAACP* erroneously cited the Youth File as Series A in *Part 19A* and Series B in *Part 19B*. Scholarly citations for all parts of the Youth File should refer to Series E (Group I, Series E for the records contained on *Part 19A* and Group II, Series E for the records contained on *Part 19B* and *Part 19C*).

EDITORIAL NOTE

This edition comprises the second half of the subject file of the NAACP Youth Department for 1940–1955. Every file has been microfilmed in its entirety. The first half of the file is microfilmed as *Papers of the NAACP, Part 19B*.

Professors August Meier and John H. Bracey Jr. edited out a small number of the subject files from this series because of a dearth of research value. In addition, two companion series of Youth Department records have not been microfilmed because of their relative lack of research value. These omitted series—the Geographical File and The Membership Report File—are open to researchers at the Library of Congress.
